(C7) When you're feeling tired of (F) dancing
(C7) Try and find a place to (F) park
(D7) Go to any cozy (G) corner
(Dm) Take advantage of the (G) dark.

(Am) Just forget you haven't got a dime
(F) Roll up the (G) carpet, and (C) push back the (A7) chairs
